I have the honor to acquaint you that I arrived here from Cayo Blanco this morning, from whence I have much satisfaction in stating the Negroes who were captured in the "Negrita" sailed in good health on Saturday the 20<sup>th</sup> Inst. in a fast sailing Brigantine, the Carolina, sent by the Spanish Government to carry them to Trinidad. She appeared well calculated to accommodate them comfortably and well supplied with the necessary stores and provisions for the voyage. I accompanied the Carolina as far as the Key-Sal Bank where I
